Dear Parents and Carers

We are all hoping that when we return to school in September, it will be as normal as it can be, but to ensure everyone is as safe as possible we have written a risk assessment which will be on our website. This letter contains some of the information that you and your children will need to know.

The school gates will open at 8:40am, no bagels will be served for the first few weeks, we will review this as soon as possible. Children should bring their own healthy snack for break (fruit or vegetable, nothing in a packet) as no snacks will be available to buy. All children will be given a water bottle which will remain in school. Children should bring as little to school as possible. We will provide all their writing equipment, so only lunch boxes will be needed. If your child has school meals, please be aware that only cold lunches will be provided for the first few weeks. This is because some pupils will eat in their classrooms instead of the hall. A separate sandwich request form will be sent to you to complete and return with your child's sandwich preference.

To avoid bringing in PE bags we are asking pupils to come wearing their PE Kit and stay in it all day on their 2 PE Days. (You will be notified which days this will be for your child(ren) in the first week back).

Only pupils will be allowed in school (apart from our Early Years parents) and the school office will remain inaccessible. Please ring the office, email or send a dojo message if you need to inform us of anything. You will not be able to speak to teachers on the playground at either the beginning or the end of the day. Please remember to socially distance from others if you are waiting on the playground. The gates will close at 9am in the morning and open at 3:10pm for collection.

The children will be in 4 'bubble groups' EYFS, KS1, (Ys 1 and 2) LKS2, (Ys 3 and 4) and UKS2 (Ys 5 and 6) These groups will remain as separate as possible, break times and lunch times will be staggered. Extra cleaning will be undertaken and everyone will be regularly washing and sanitising hands. Please see the risk assessment for more details. We hope with all these measures you will feel assured that we are mitigating the risks and keeping everyone as safe as possible.

If you have any further questions or concerns, please contact school. Once again I would like to thank you for all your support and hard work with your children's home learning over this difficult time. We all wish you a safe and enjoyable Summer and look forward to seeing everyone on Wednesday 2nd September.
