Restorative Conversation

If a child receives a consequence for not following the school rules, it is followed by a restorative conversation.

These questions are used to help the child recognise what they did wrong and how they can act differently next time.

- What happened?
- How did you feel?
- How do feel now?
- Who else has been affected?
- What do we need to do now to make it right?
- How can we avoid it happening again?

Having these conversations, ensures children learn from their mistakes.
